While the COVID-19 pandemic continues to occupy much of their time, our teams at Winchester District Memorial Hospital, Dundas Manor, and the WDMH Foundation are also finding ways to take a break and re-group after an incredible 18 months of caring. Together, they have worked hard to keep patients, residents, and each other safe. We are thankful to our local communities for your positive messages and generous donations.

We are not there yet, but there is light at the end of the tunnel. And we are excited to look to the future and all the possibilities.

The WDMH Foundation continues to raise funds to support health care close to home at WDMH. In fact, \$330,277 - including 29 new pieces of equipment and a major upgrade to WDMH's wireless network – was transferred to WDMH last year. COVID-19 delayed some of the hospital's requests to the Foundation for medical equipment purchases, but in the last two months alone, 8 pieces of equipment have been funded, totaling close to \$150,000. The WDMH Foundation is also proud of its growing partnership with Dundas Manor, with a special focus on the campaign for a new long-term care home. We are putting the pieces in place and getting ready for the public launch down the road. It is exciting to take on this challenge, knowing that local communities will be behind us every step of the way.

The Right Tools

TUCKED AWAY NEAR WDMH'S OPERATING ROOM IS MDRD – the Medical Device Reprocessing Department. The MDRD team plays an important role, ensuring that equipment is clean, sterilized, and ready for use when needed.

Recently, because of our generous donors, the Foundation was able to provide funds for a new sink for the department. This specialized sink is used to clean and sterilize surgical tools and equipment. It is ergonomically designed and moves up and down. This provides a safer, more comfortable experience for staff members, no matter what their height. Small things like this make a big difference!

The cost of the sink was \$18,092.57.
