

WELCOME TO THIS EDITION OF *BECAUSE OF You***.** This month, we want to share great news about some new equipment – 71 pieces in fact – that is making a big impact at Winchester District Memorial Hospital. It's all thanks to our amazing donors!

Instant information – instantly recorded! That's the idea behind the new Vital Signs Monitors. Because of you, every patient room at Winchester District Memorial Hospital (WDMH) will have a new vital piece of equipment.

The vital sign monitors will result in safer care and more time for patient care. When a nurse takes a patient's blood pressure or other vitals such as heart rate or temperature, the information will flow directly into the patient's electronic health record from the machine. A huge thank you to everyone who supported this important initiative. The total cost of 70 monitors: \$482,632.75!

It's a 'shocking' new piece of equipment! A new defibrillator life pack will continue to help save lives on the Medical Surgical Unit at WDMH – thanks to you. The new pack replaces an aging device that will now be used for staff training sessions.

A defibrillator is a device that sends an electric pulse or shock to the heart to restore a normal heartbeat. It is used to prevent or correct an arrhythmia, which is an uneven heartbeat that is too slow or too fast. If the heart suddenly stops, a defibrillator can also help it beat again.

This piece of equipment supports both patient care and education – so it's a win-win. The new defibrillator life pack costs \$14,660.29.

Planning for the New Dundas Manor Continues

CONSTRUCTION ON THE NEW DUNDAS MANOR IS EXPECTED TO BEGIN NEXT YEAR. It will take about two years to complete the new building. We want to thank everyone who is helping to make this dream a reality.

"We've been out and about talking about Dundas Manor and the need to build a new home for our residents and community," explains CEO Cholly Boland. "We've also been working closely with the government, asking for more funding support due to the rising construction costs."

The Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care will fund some of the cost of the new home, but not all of it. That's where our community comes in. Two years ago, Dundas Manor partnered with the WDMH Foundation to lead the community fundraising portion of this essential project.

"The Foundation staff and a small but mighty group of volunteers have been working hard behind the scenes," notes Kristen Casselman, Managing Director of the WDMH Foundation. "So far, we've been meeting with those who we feel are interested in Long-Term Care and may be interested in making a significant financial investment. The response has been very positive. This important fundraising work will continue until the needed funds are raised."

WDMH HAS INTRODUCED A NEW HEALTH INFORMATION SYSTEM CALLED **E**PIC.

Simply put, patients will get better access to their own health information and more seamless care from their providers. Epic replaces the current hospital information systems made up of multiple electronic and paper-based systems containing different parts of a patient's health record. Epic gives the patient's care team the information they need at their fingertips. A wonderful feature we are getting (only because of our donors!) is "single sign on" technology. This allows care providers to securely sign into all the systems they need with one username and password.
