

They're Here!

Because of you, WDMH has two new ultrasound machines. Technologists tell us that the guality of images from the new machines is spectacular. Technology has advanced to a point where things that were too small to be identified before can now be seen Senior Technician Denis Arsenault notes: "This is a great moment for everyone in the community. And, of course, it would not be possible without the continued support from the Foundation and generous donors. Thank you!"

The new machines cost \$232,307.74. They replace units that were 10 years old. In the past 10 years, almost 70,000 ultrasounds have been done at WDMH, with over 8,100 procedures in the last year alone.

Seeing Is Believing



∧ new microscope **for eye surgery** is making a difference for cataract and strabismus eye surgeries. It acts as a very high intense magnification that the eye surgeon

looks through at the same time as performing the surgery. In the last 8 years, more than 3,500 eye surgeries have been performed at WDMH. The new microscope cost \$94,731.21 and replaces one that was about 20 years old.

Cadillac Beds



C tudies show that we spend about one **Othird of our life in bed.** And when we are in the hospital, it can be even more. WDMH's Complex Continuing Care Unit has three new beds to care for patients with complex needs. "The new beds have many special features that are very beneficial for our patients and help make it easier for us to care for them," notes Team Leader Sean Burnett. "Thank you to the generous donors who helped provide this specialized equipment." The cost of the three beds was \$34,724.12.

In addition, WDMH's Childbirth Centre has two new birthing beds. These specialized beds have stirrups, can move into a full upright position and have a removable end, making things easier for Moms and healthcare providers. This past year, 737 babies were born at WDMH. The new beds cost \$42,710.
