# **Please Have a Seat**

Because of you ... patients coming to the Emergency Room will be a little more comfortable, thanks to a new procedure chair. The chair is used when patients require a cast or stitches.

"The old chair was from the 1990s and it helped fix up many people over the years," says Team Leader Shannon Horsburgh. "The new chair offers many improved features. It moves electronically with foot pedals. It can go quite low to the ground so it's easy for everyone to sit in. It can also move more into a bed-like position and even tilts back for those who might feel a little light headed with the ordeal of getting stitches or a cast."

The chair costs \$13,896.40.




#### **Moustache Mania**

On January 21st, the committed team wrapped up their November DTFAS event and presented a cheque for \$5,864.50 to the WDMH Foundation, representing half of the funds raised. The other half was donated to The Ottawa Hospital.

She provides support and education to cancer patients and their families — helping them navigate their care and connect with local community resources. The service is available to all cancer patients in the local area and no referrals are required.

#### **Around the Corner: Your Future with WDMH**

There are so many ways to plan a future gift. Of course, we appreciate any gifts that you make, regardless of their size, or the way in which they're given. However, there are some tools you may not be aware of that could help lighten your burden if you were already planning on making a gift to us - now or in the future. This section will be a regular feature in the newsletter, so please keep your eyes open for future stories!

You have the power to change the world. Or at least a corner of it here at your hospital, WDMH.

Saving for your retirement has become an essential part of a complete financial plan. But beyond thinking about how much you're saving for retirement, have you ever thought about what would happen to your RRSP, RRIF, or TFSA when you pass away (or your surviving spouse does)?

When it comes to transferring your wealth to the next generation, retirement funds are among your most heavily taxed assets. Wouldn't it be a shame to lose almost 50% of your savings to income taxes? When you pass away, registered assets like your RRSPs, RRIFs or TFSAs can only be rolled over tax-free to a surviving spouse, or disabled child. They are taxed at the rate of your income in the year you pass if they're transferred to children or other next of kin (which for most is a higher bracket since all their assets are deemed to be sold the day they pass).

Donating your RRSP or RRIF funds to the WDMH Foundation is a taxsmart and effective solution. By naming the WDMH Foundation as a beneficiary of your registered plans, you'll:

- retain ownership and use of the fund during your lifetime;
- receive a tax receipt for the value of the plan;
- avoid probate fees by removing these assets from your estate;
   and
- reduce your overall estate taxes.

You can choose to donate all or a portion of your retirement funds, and still provide for your family by naming more than one beneficiary.

The gift is simple to make. Just request a "change in beneficiary" form from your plan provider and name "The Winchester District Memorial Hospital Foundation" as beneficiary of all or a portion of the RRSP or RRIF and return the document to your provider. Thank you for your support.
