A T WDMH, FIVE NEW STRETCHERS HAVE ARRIVED to help support the care that our team provides every day. The stretchers are replacing older ones that are nearing the end of their lifespan. The stretchers are crucial for providing safe, compassionate care.

"Having these up-to-date stretchers has improved the workflow within the department while ensuring patients are comfortable during their stay.," explains Clinical Manager Katie Robertson. "The stretchers have new features such as patient controls to allow them to raise their head or feet and an alert system that helps us to monitor patients who might be at risk for falling."

"Because of our generous donors, the WDMH Foundation is pleased to support the hospital's commitment to compassionate, excellent care. Part of that commitment involves replacing equipment before it breaks or becomes unserviceable," adds WDMH Foundation Managing Director Kristen Casselman. "We are so grateful for your support."

The total cost for the stretchers is \$49,722.30. The mattresses cost \$4,330.42.



The donation will be used to help purchase much-needed medical equipment. The first \$255,000 will help purchase

a new X-ray machine, with the rest directed to the Digital Mammography Fund. The total cost of this equipment is estimated at \$973,000.

"These two pieces of equipment are used daily to make life-saving diagnoses. On behalf of the Diagnostic Imaging department and all the patients and families you will touch with this donation, thank you so much," noted Clinical Manager Katie Robertson.
