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Extraordinary Times. Extraordinary People.

WDMH's Commitment Statement speaks to One Team. This past year, our team has pulled together to respond – sometimes daily – to the many pandemic directives ordered by government. Infection control protocols and education were enhanced. Screening stations were set up. Outpatient and non-essential surgeries were impacted. And we continue to support our colleagues at retirement and long-term care homes.

In partnership with the Eastern Ontario Health Unit, WDMH set up, and continues to staff, the COVID-19 Testing Centre in Winchester – sometimes receiving more than 1,000 calls per day. The Centre has expanded to also serve as a Vaccination Clinic for highrisk populations and as an Assessment Centre for certain respiratory conditions.

In addition to our regular work, WDMH has cared for COVID-19 patients and welcomed other patients transferred from city hospitals. More than 95% of WDMH staff and physicians have chosen to receive both doses of the COVID-19 vaccine. WDMH was one of only two hospitals in the region where staff members volunteered to go and work in impacted city hospitals. A true one team's spirit.

Despite the impact of the pandemic, other work has continued as well. Quality and patient safety remain our #1 priority. Successes include low re-admission rates, a new video to assist pre-operative patients, post-discharge phone calls in Complex Continuing Care, Pharmacy Accreditation, and continued research to improve patient care. We are also proud of our high patient satisfaction rates.

WDMH is proud to be partnering with the Trillium Gift of Life Network (TGLN) to save more lives through organ and tissue donation. To date, more than two dozen referrals have taken place, resulting in two successful eye donors.

We have welcomed new staff and physicians throughout the year, including a Geriatrician



and a Respiratory Therapist. And we have continued to teach students throughout the hospital.

Collaboration with health and community partners has been more important than ever. WDMH is helping to develop the Upper Canada/Cornwall and Area Ontario Health Team.

Even through our masks, WDMH spirit shines through Recreation Committee events, our Commitment Awards, and a socially distanced Long-term Service Awards celebration. We also give back to our community through initiatives such as the Christmas Angel program.

When we speak of gratitude, we must express sincere appreciation to the amazing WDMH team – close to 1,000 staff, physicians,

volunteers, and trainees. When COVID-19 arrived, this team got to work, and we are so proud of them.



We can't look back on the past year without saying thank you to our local communities for your incredible support. We felt you rallying around us in a circle of love and encouragement.


At Dundas Manor, we end each of our Facebook posts with two hearts in green and

We have witnessed the staff and physicians at WDMH and Dundas Manor providing incredible care under impossible circumstances. It is a true team effort.

The Right Tools

Because of our donors, the Foundation has been able to provide Winchester District Memorial Hospital with \$330,277, allowing the hospital to purchase 29 pieces of equipment over the last year, and do a major upgrade to WDMH's wireless network.

But those numbers do not tell the whole story. COVID-19 delayed some of the hospital's requests to the Foundation for medical equipment purchases. In the past two months alone, the Foundation has already funded 8 pieces of equipment, totaling close to \$150,000. And we are ready to do even more in the coming year.

Every piece of equipment makes a difference. For example, the new portable ultrasound machine in the Emergency Department produces images that are much clearer and more detailed, resulting in faster diagnosis. "It's the best I've seen – a Cadillac," says Emergency physician Dr. Adam Jones-Delcorde. "When a patient is critically ill, we can see the cause such as a collapsed lung or a ruptured aortic aneurysm. Or I can use the machine to find gallstones, kidney stones, or blood clots. From there, our colleagues in radiology and cardiology can do further investigation."

Many people do not realize that the government does not pay for medical equipment. We are so grateful for our community's support.



Planned gifts, such as bequests, shares, or life insurance, can impact health care for many years to come. The Foundation was


honoured and touched to receive 25 planned gifts this past year, totaling almost \$3.6 million.


