We are pleased to report that three new anesthetic machines have now been purchased – thanks to the generosity of our donors. The cost of the new machines was \$215,540.67.

"The successful matching gift program, combined with a portion of a recent estate gift, has resulted in total funding for the anesthetic machines – much sooner than expected," reports Kristen Casselman, Managing Director. "We are so grateful to everyone for your support."



"The machines are smaller, easier to move and more ergonomic. And the displays are easy to read and adjustable which helps us see the vital signs more clearly," notes Dr.

This community is what makes this a special place to work and receive care. Equipment such as this has a direct impact on the clinical care that WDMH provides. Together You Can – And You Did!

The new echocardiogram machine has also arrived – only because of our donors. The new echocardiogram cost \$150,360.09 and several types



of donations helped the Foundation to purchase it. These include a portion of a donor's estate gift, a donation of shares, a matching gift program, and proceeds from a third-party event.

The new echocardiogram machine was identified as WDMH's number one medical equipment need in 2017. The new machine has many advantages in efficiency and patient care. In the past, the images produced by the old machine were not as clear. As a result, some patients had to travel to another hospital to have the procedure done again. The old machine was not adjustable, meaning that the technician had to adjust their stance to accommodate the machine. Finally, with the new machine, WDMH has been able to expand its services to include contrast and stress echocardiograms.

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"Every single gift matters, whatever the amount. This equipment purchase is proof of that," notes Kristen Casselman, WDMH Foundation Managing Director.

GOOD CATCH

Our community also generously supported the purchase of our new Automated Dispensing Cabinets (ADCs) – and they are already making a difference in how we care for patients every day. The new cabinets, and accompanying pill packager, help to ensure the right medication for the right patient at the right time.

Pharmacy Technician Jennifer Deschamps notes that the new technology has taken WDMH's patient safety culture to a new level. "We have already seen some good catches. The new system reduces the risk of medication errors, electronically tracks usage and even includes medication alerts right on the screen."



n the last 20 years, 96 people have chosen to plan ahead and support WDMH into the future - still supporting health care close to home, long after they were gone. What a legacy for them, and how fortunate for WDMH and the patients we care for. WDMH would not be what it is today without the support of its donors. Not everything WDMH needs to provide compassionate, excellent care is funded by the provincial government.

Planned gifts are a way for donors to help make their hopes and dreams for WDMH come true.

The most common type of planned gift is a gift in a will, but there are many other types like a life insurance policy; an RRSP or RRIF or publicly traded securities.

"For those who have ever wished they could do something, or something more, for their local hospital – or for those who would like to pay less taxes now or through their estate, a planned gift is something to seriously consider," explains Kristen Casselman, the Foundation's Managing Director. "Because of Canada's generous tax system when it comes to charitable giving, it's pretty amazing what someone can achieve for themselves, their family and WDMH with a well-planned gift."

No one is obligated to share their plans with the Foundation. However, by doing so, the Foundation is able to invite planned giving donors into their Society of Compassionate Care Forever. This is a way for Foundation staff and volunteers to express their gratitude to donors who have made this decision. Regardless of the planned gift amount, one of the benefits of the Society is the option for donors to have their name published on the new donor wall. "It's very meaningful for us to be able to thank and recognize people for what they are doing for local health care at WDMH. Our new donor wall will help with that," adds Kristen.

"We are honoured and grateful to work with donors who are giving a planned gift to the Foundation in support of WDMH. 




CHECK YOUR MAILBOX
